# 3- Grants

## Received

AARP: \$2,350 received for Cornell Park interpretive signs

Stewardship grant: \$31,000 for Noble – Joyce was at the training and reported that we don't need a formal bid, only a quote from 3 contractors. They also upped the volunteer hour value to \$25.

Steele Reese: Need to find a project almost near completion. Cliff Trail? Next RTP or stewardship grant: changing the Normal Street foot bridge.

# 4- Cornell park

Jack Kirkley wrote a bird habitat text for a sign.

Pete Bengeyfield wrote text for the stream restoration sign and drew some diagrams before/after restoration.

Laura Connors is designing them.

AARP is willing to extend the grant deadline to May 31, 2022 (to pay for the signs).
